Agences National de Gestion des Stations d'Épuration du Mali (ANGESEM)

L'Agence Nationale de Gestion des Stations d'Épuration du Mali (ANGESEM) was created by the order No. 07-015/P-RM of 28/03/2007. It is placed under the supervision of the Ministry of the environment, sanitation and sustainable development.

ANGESEM Mission

Ensure the Sustainable management of wastewater treatment plant and ancillary works stations through:

- Coordination, control and monitoring of the work
- The contribution to the transfer of ownership from the State to local authorities.




Yamoussoukro

Office National de l'Assainissement et du Drainage (ONAD)

Crown Corporation, created December 28, 2011 by Decree n° 2011-482 with an institutional allocation of delegate owner. The ONAD is on the one hand under the technical supervision of the Ministry in charge of sanitation and on the other hand the financial supervision of the Ministry in charge of the budget.

ONAD Mission:

Access to facilities, sanitation and drainage, in a sustainable manner and at competitive costs, of the national population.



Kampala

Kampala Capital City Authority (KCCA)

KCCA is a special corporate body that was put in place to govern Kampala City. KCCA was established in 2010 by an Act of Parliament. The actual operations of KCCA started in April 2011. As a corporate body, KCCA has a Minister and Deputy Minister. Below the Minister, there is a technical wing and the political wing. The technical wing is headed by the Executive Director, who is appointed by the President of the Republic of Uganda. The political wing is headed by the Lord Mayor, who is elected by the people of Kampala through universal adult suffrage. The political wing is responsible for policy issues and oversees the activities of the technical wing.

Mandate of KCCA

- To administer and mobilize local revenue and provide public services in the city.
- To promote and control physical development in the city
- To promote socio-economic development in the city
- Ensure Provision of safe water and sanitation in communities



Dakar

Office National de l'Assainissement du Sénégal (ONAS)


L'Office National de l'Assainissement du Sénégal (ONAS) is a public establishment of Industrial and commercial management of the sanitation sector. It was created by law No. 96-02 February 22, 1996, and organized by the order in Council 96-667 August 07, 1996.

Lusaka

Lusaka Water and Sewerage Company (LWSC)

Lusaka Water and Sewerage Company Limited is one of the Commercial Utilities in Zambia. It is charged with the responsibility to provide water and sanitation services to towns in Lusaka province including the City of Lusaka. It was registered under the Company's Act in 1988 but only commenced its operations in 1990. The areas under the jurisdiction of the utility include Lusaka City, Luangwa, Kafue, Chongwe and Chirundu districts and is in the process of establishing operations in Shilubanyu and Rufunsa Districts.

LWSC Vision and Mission

Yaounde

Yaounde Urban Council (YUC)

The Yaounde Urban Council is a decentralized territorial unit which includes 7 councils. Law n° 2004-18 of July 22, 2004 transferred to YUC the competence relative to the creation, the development, the maintenance, the exploitation and the management of the community equipment's in the field of sanitation, wastewater and rain water.

In its current organization chart, sanitation tasks are divided between two departments:

- The Department of Urban Planning, Architecture and Living Environment which has within it the services of Hygiene and the Environment, Urbanism as well as that of Architecture;
- The Department of Infrastructure and Development of Equipment, which has the water and sanitation service

eThekweni Water and Sanitation (EWS) is a unit of the eThekweni municipality and is responsible for the provision of water and sanitation services to all customers in the municipality. The Unit is continually looking for new and innovative ways to provide services to our customers and has been recognized through many awards and acknowledgements. EWS has been able to use GIS based tools, specially developed call center, electronic workflow and document management software to further improve service delivery.
